

## EUTHANASIA ISSUES POLL November 2017

- CLIENT: Euthanasia-Free NZ
- **POLL DATES**: Mon 30 October to Tue 14 November 2017. The median response was collected on Mon 06 November 2017.

TARGET POPULATION: New Zealand adults.

**SAMPLE POPULATION:** New Zealand adults who are contactable on a landline or mobile phone.

**SAMPLE SIZE**: 894 respondents agreed to participate.

**SAMPLE SELECTION**: A random selection of 15,000 nationwide phone numbers.

**WEIGHTING**: The results are weighted to reflect the overall voting adult population in terms of gender, age, and area.

- **SAMPLE ERROR**: Based on this sample of 894 respondents, the maximum sampling error (for a result of 50%) is +/- 3.3%, at the 95% confidence level.
- **CODE COMPLIANCE:** This poll was conducted in accordance with the New Zealand Political Polling Code, the Research Association New Zealand Code of Practice and the International Chamber of Commerce/European Society for Opinion and Market Research Code on Market and Social Research.





It has been proposed that people with a terminal or irremediable condition should be allowed assistance to end their lives, also called assisted dying. To what extent do you support or oppose assisted dying? Do you strongly oppose, somewhat oppose, somewhat support or strongly support it?

#### Assisted Dying BY New view on assisted dying

This table shows the views of respondents to the original question on assisted dying and what their view is after being told that the bill's definition of assisted dying. The results should be read across in rows so for example of those who somewhat supported assisted dying, 5% then strongly opposed it, 6% somewhat opposed it, 9% became neutral, 65% remained somewhat supportive and 9% became strongly supportive.
